# Crime Prevention Environmental Design (CPTED)

CPTED principles combines proper design, crime prevention practices, and effective uses of the environment to decrease crime and improve the quality of life

#### 1. Lighting

Replace all light fixtures with "dark skies" fixtures. Motion-Sensor lighting is highly recommended.

These fixtures eliminate glare and shadows,

LED lighting allows true colors to be seen at night (and lowers your electricity bills).

#### 2. Surveillance

Video surveillance is your 24/7 witness to help law enforcement catch criminals. Invest in quality surveillance with remote viewing and voice controls.

Place (screened off0 seating facing the parking lot and entrance points.

#### 3. Screening

Attractive screens (fencing) maintain privacy and deter graffiti, while allowing visibility into your property AND onto your parking lot and entry ways.

#### 4. Hardscapes

Landscape rocks, such as river rock, deter longterm standing or resting **and** can help conserve water.

#### 5. Lock It Up

Lock and install a roof on all dumpster enclosures to prevent "dumpster diving' and illegal dumping.

#### 6. Block Access

Block roll-up doors with vehicles or heavy equipment at night to prevent break-ins.

#### 6. Open Views

Eliminate hiding areas and open the view to increase surveillance.

#### Use the 2 foot / 6 foot rule:

Trim branches 6 feet up from the ground. Keep smaller bush no more than 2 feet in height.



# Crime Prevention & Best Practices

- Practice observe & reporting skills often.
- Inspect your property daily/several times a week.
- Turn off Wi-Fi after hours.
- Remove outdoor access to water and electricity.
- Move the placement of expensive items periodically.
- Secure all tools in a locked structure out of view.
- Remove keys from vehicles & check locked doors.
- Block roll up doors with large vehicles.
- Contract with a tow company. Post "Tow Away," "No Trespassing," and "No Loitering" signs.
- Cover walls with live or artificial greenery or art.
- In the event of a robbery, stop business and preserve evidence (don't touch anything).
- ETS tag placement- Sheriff's office allows for electronic tracking of stolen goods.
- Lock all dumpsters during the day.
- Install doors and a roof and dumpster enclosures.
- Install bright outdoor lighting and quality surveillance with motion detection and remote voice capability.
- Cut tall brush and trees 6' from ground and trim brush to 2' in height.
